Whole Person Health Ministry

I want to summarize a great article on Preventing Falls and Fractures by Marilyn S. Radke, MD, source the National Institute on Aging: www.nia.nih.gov.

Falls are the number one cause of broken bones and hospital admissions for trauma and injury deaths among older adults. Broken hips are also a leading cause of injury and loss of independence among older adults. Only one-half of older adults hospitalized for a broken hip are able to return home or live alone after the fall. Falls also can cause broken bones in the pelvis, spine, arm, hand or ankle.

The following are factors leading to falls:

- Muscle weakness in the legs
- Pain or numbness in the feet;
- Poor balance or difficulty walking;
- Blood pressure that drops too low on standing;
- Vision problems
- Side effects of medications
- Unsafe footwear
- Clutter on floors, stairs or loose rugs;
- Poor lighting indoors or outdoors;
- Lack of handrails along stairs and grab bars in the bathroom

- Carrying heavy or bulky things, especially on stairs.

These are steps to prevent falls:

- Exercise to maintain balance, muscle and bone strength
- Have your blood pressure checked when lying and standing
- Proper shoes with nonslip soles
- Remove clutter and hazards such as pet bowls
- Use nonslip rugs and bath mats; avoid icy or wet walkways;
- Use night lights and proper lighting in hallways
- Carry a mobile phone from room to room and do not rush to answer the telephone or door;
- Quit smoking and limit alcohol intake

Little Grand Canyon by Dr. Dr. Rhonda Forlow



My family and I are LOVING life here in Texas! Living in a state that is so close to many of the United States' beautiful mountains, deep canyons, and wide varieties of landscapes has been wonderful. One such area is the Texas Hill Country, near San Antonio.

The Texas Hill Country is located in central Texas and features many wonderful geological surprises. In the summer of 2002, a record amount of rain fell in the Hill Country and overfilled nearby Canyon Lake. The abundant water spilled over the dam, causing erosion downstream. The outcome of that storm is an area now called Canyon Lake Gorge, a place with deep, wide, steep-walled canyons carved through the limestone bedrock.

Scientists study the rock formations, fossils, and sediment in other, more famous canyons, such as Grand Canyon. And while some scientists believe it took the Colorado River millions of years to carve through the strata and erode Grand Canyon, other scientists notice other features that don't seem to fit that story. Pointing out that the erosion style and character are not compatible with river erosion, they have begun to look to more recent canyons of known origin for a better way of thinking. Is there another explanation? A better explanation?

In 1982, just 2 years after Mount St. Helens erupted, another seismic episode in the area shook loose the unstable rock near the crater and caused a fast-moving mudflow that quickly carved a canyon near the mountain's base. That canyon has been called "The Little Grand Canyon," because it is a 1/40th scale model of Grand Canyon. Through these two events and others, scientists are coming to better realize how larger canyons, like Grand Canyon, could be quickly carved in a massive catastrophic event, such as the global Flood of Noah's day.
