The Pastor's Corner

The Resurrection of Christ

An honest skeptic once asked a Christian pastor: "If it could be proven that Jesus Christ never rose from the grave--then what? The pastor thought for a moment, looked his questioner squarely in the eye, and replied:

- "Then for twenty centuries, a million martyrs have died for nothing."
- "Then twenty centuries of Christian preaching have been nothing but a hoax and a lie."
- "Then the faith of countless millions over the centuries has been totally in vain."
- "Then all who believe in Jesus Christ are still living in their sins and will be eternally lost."
- "Then those who have died trusting in Jesus Christ have perished."
- "Then Christian people everywhere are of all men most to be pitied!"

There are many things in history that are open to debate. But the resurrection of Christ is not one of them. It is one of the most well-attested events in antiquity. And the Christian faith rests upon the historical reality of Easter. As Saint Paul so candidly put it, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (1 Cor. 15:17).

But on Easter evening, the risen Christ appeared to the women and apostles in the upper room. And over the span of forty days, our Lord appeared to many. On one day, Jesus showed himself alive to over



500 people at one time (1 Cor. 15:6). They were eyewitnesses to the fact that Christ was alive! If the resurrection were just an elaborate hoax, how do we explain the fact that all of the apostles (except John) gladly suffered martyr's deaths? People simply do not die for something they KNOW TO BE A LIE.

Dr. Paul L. Maier, professor of ancient history at Western Michigan University, concluded that, "If all the evidence is weighed carefully and fairly, it is indeed justifiable, according to the canons of historical research, to conclude that the tomb in which Jesus was buried was actually empty on the morning of the first Easter. And no shred of evidence has yet been discovered in literary sources, epigraphy or archaeology that would disprove this statement."

So what does Easter mean? It is the evidence that Jesus defeated the grave. It is also the evidence that God the Father accepted Christ's Good Friday sacrifice as payment-in-full for all human sin. Moreover, Christ's resurrection is the proof that believers will also rise to eternal life. Christ comes to you and me and says, "Because I live, you shall live also" (John 14:19).

May God grant us all a blessed Easter Season!

Whole Person Health Ministry:

- STOP THE BLEED: This national campaign is to build resilience by better preparing the public to save lives by raising awareness of basic actions to stop life threatening bleeding following everyday emergencies and man-made and natural disasters. Both the Elders and the Church Council recently approved this program for Redeemer. The Trauma Coordinator at Harris FW Hospital will come out and do the training. Watch for more details and time and date. We have requested the program for the second or fourth Sunday in June, following Divine Service. We hope to serve a light lunch followed by the 2-hour training. Seating is limited to 15, so we will have a signup sheet on the Narthex WPHM Bulletin Board beginning in mid-May. Should we have more people interested, we may be able to repeat the training perhaps later this summer. For questions on this or any of our programs, please see or call Donna Riccono.
- CPR course repeated this summer: Cathy Gonzalez and Donna Riccono will offer CPR again this summer, probably Saturday, July 29th. Watch for a sign-up sheet for this in early July.
- Cathy and Donna will be attending the 25th Annual Concordia Conference for Parish Nurse and Congregational Health Ministries on May 24 and 25th, in Mequon, WI. The conference costs are covered in the WPHM Budget, for which we thank the congregation. Generous donors to WPHM this past year has allowed us to also include some travel expenses for Cathy, attending the Conference for the first time. We are very grateful to those who have designated donations to WPHM.
- NO MAY Blood Pressure screening this month only, since we are away. To make up for May we will have Blood Pressure Screening both the first and fourth Sundays in June, avoiding usual 3rd Sunday which is Father's Day.
- A MATTER OF BALANCE workshop that we held at Redeemer in June of 2013 will be repeated. fear of falling. It helps participants in mind and body to stay mobile while dealing with physical mobility problems. Again, for questions please just let me know. The workshop will be held on 8 consecutive Thursday mornings, September 21^{st} through November 9^{th} , from 10 am -12 noon.



The Captive Conscience



He who feels no sin will not be impelled to seek grace; he will pay no attention either to the Gospel or to faith. Therefore the Law is conscience's jailer, chains, fetters, and prison. The Law points to sin and exposes it, and thus it takes conscience captive (Romans 4:15; 7:7, 8). God does not deliver us from these bonds whenever we deem it necessary, but He permits us to be humbled and tormented in them until we thirst for grace. Now He comes and gives us His Word, to which we cling, and leads us out of captivity. Thus we escape a terrified and despondent conscience, and we get a good and sure conscience. That is the twofold work and performance of Christ in us: He kills us, and He resurrects us; He humbles us, and he exalts us, each in His good season. . . .
